

The 7th RISCOON TOKYO ended with great success Security & Safety Trade Expo 2011

The Security & Safety Trade Expo 2011 (RISCOON TOKYO 2011), one of the largest comprehensive risk and crisis management markets in Japan was held for a three-day period from October 19th (Wed) to the 21st (Fri), closed with great success. RISCOON TOKYO 2011 attracted 346 companies and organizations as exhibitors with 537 booths, a 40% increase over the previous RISCOON TOKYO, with the total number of visitors reaching 63,274*.

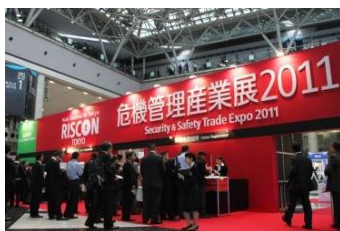
With the concept for this year's show "For Post-Disaster Reconstruction and a New Safe and Secure Society," the 7th RISCOON TOKYO showcased a wide variety of products, technologies and services that strongly appealed for the need to prepare countermeasures against disasters and contingency planning. As RISCOON TOKYO was held shortly after the Great East Japan Earthquake, which had caused such enormous damage and loss of life, social concerns on the importance of crisis management have rapidly escalated. Theme zones such as "Disaster contingency planning" and "Measures for people who have difficulties returning home" drew a great deal of attention.

Special conferences held include an on-site report about the accident at the Fukushima Dai-ichi Nuclear Power Plant presented by Mr. Shigeharu Aoyama, and a report about a dispatched unit's disaster relief efforts in response to the Great East Japan Earthquake presented by the Tokyo Fire Department, both of which were keenly received by visitors.

In addition to RISCOON TOKYO 2011, the Special Equipment Exhibition & Conference for Anti-Terrorism (SEECAT) '11 and the Measures of Asbestos & Environmental Risk Exhibition and Conference (ASREX) '11 were held simultaneously and attracted a large number of visitors.

The next RISCOON TOKYO is scheduled to be held from October 17th (Wed) to October 19th (Fri) in 2012.
